Preparing for the start of your course

Your journey with us starts with a two-day induction to your course and the services available to you as a student at Health Sciences University. The focus will be on helping you familiarise yourself with the university and providing you with useful information to ensure your time as a student is successful. It is important that you attend all induction sessions on your timetable.

Your first day will include:

- A welcome from our Vice-Chancellor and our Students' Union team.
- Your official enrolment at the university, including important checks related to your visa.
- A tour of our campus.
- An IT induction to set you up with access to our IT systems.
- Student wellbeing workshops.
- An opportunity to get to know students and staff and join our Students' Union team for afternoon tea.

Your second day will include:

- A course orientation session with the course team.
- An introduction to library services.
- A study skills workshop.
- Complimentary lunch.
- Our registry and IT teams will also be available to assist with any issues not covered on day 1.

Course Delivery Structure

For your course diary, **each course core unit is delivered over a four-week cycle** starting from Thursday 15 January 2026, comprising of a total of 48 tutor contact hours and 152 independent and guided study notional hours required per unit. Your English for academic purposes (EAP) unit is delivered over 11 weeks with varied instructional hours estimated.

You will attend classes in-person on campus and online as seen in the four-weekly delivery cycle schedule summary below:

11-Weeks English for Academic Purpose Classes

As part of your study, you will undergo an 11-week English for Academic Purpose (EAP) course to be held on Wednesday from the second week of teaching, starting 22 January 2026. These are mandatory classes and are part of your course curriculum.

Group and 1-2-1 Tutorial Opportunities

There will be opportunities to attend unit tutorials scheduled virtually as required by course unit lead and tutors.

Units Delivery and Assessments

Each unit you undertake on your course is delivered over set days during the week and assessed by a variety of methods including a combination of essays, reports, presentations, case studies and market analyses, reflective commentaries, live consultancy projects and written examination. As an enrolled student at the University, you are entering into an agreement to study the course and attend all scheduled sessions punctually and undertake all associated assessments components on the programme.

UK Weather in Winter

British weather during Winter period can be unpredictable and may be very cold so please ensure you come prepared with warm, weatherproof clothing when you arrive in the UK.

Where to Stay in the UK

We understand that for many of you, this will be your first experience travelling alone and to a foreign country, which is truly exciting. We recommend that you make relevant accommodation arrangements prior to your arrival in the UK, which should be ideally not more than 10 miles from the University campus at **275 Borough High Street, London, SE1 1JE**. It is important to note that the University (HSU) **does not provide any accommodation arrangements including temporary or permanent provisions.**

University Enrolment Documents Checklist

To complete your university enrolment process successfully, you must bring the following documents with you in-person on your first day of induction. This will be either Wednesday 7 January or Thursday 8 January dependent on your Group.

1. Your current passport

- This must be the original. You should also bring a copy of photo data page.

2. Your current UK visa share code

- If you are applying for a student visa, you should not travel to the UK until the start date of this visa.

3. Evidence of your UK entry date

- This could be either an entry stamp in your passport, boarding pass or flight ticket.

4. Original certificates of your academic qualifications

- These should be the qualifications listed on your CAS, as well as:
- Your highest qualification (if different to the qualification on your CAS)
- Official translations (if applicable)

5. Your UK address and contact details

This documentary evidence and information is a mandatory UKVI requirement. You must provide this to the university before you will be permitted to formally enrol.



London Campus IT Systems Requirements

To access the University IT Systems as a student, there are some **minimum systems requirements** that we have highlighted below:

Minimum supported personal equipment

- All students are required to have a smartphone that is currently within the manufacturer's support window.
- To access any Health Sciences University resources Microsoft authenticator must be installed and updated on a smartphone.

PHONES and TABLETS

Apple OS

- We advise students should have iOS 18 as a minimum operating system on any iOS device. As historically, Apple tends to end support for older OS version after 12-18 months of introducing a new version. An iOS 18 enabled device will ensure access to HSU systems for the duration of your study at HSU.

Android OS

- A minimum of Android 14 OS is required for all Android devices.

LAPTOPS and COMPUTERS

Microsoft OS

- We are advising students to ensure that any personal Microsoft laptop or computer has a Windows 11 installed or can be upgraded to this. This is to ensure you can access HSU systems after Microsoft support for Windows 10 ends in October 2025.

Apple OS

- An Apple Mac OS version 14 (Sonoma) is the minimum macOS allowed on all personal Apple devices, this will normally have active and supported anti-virus software installed.

Important note:

- ✓ All devices must have a valid and active anti-virus product installed and be set to automatically install operating system updates.
- ✓ **HSU provides Microsoft Office** (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, Teams, and OneNote) **to students free of charge for the duration of their course.** The software can be installed on up to five devices, including laptops, desktop computers, mobile phones, and tablet devices.

Nearby Popular Landmarks: The campus is within short walking distance of several iconic London landmarks including The Shard, Tower Bridge, Borough Market, and the London Eye.

Public Transport Options:

- **Tube (London Underground):** **Borough station** is on the Northern line and is the closest tube station to our London campus. When exiting the station turn right and our building is located approximately 1 minute away on the other side of the road.
- **Train:** **London Bridge Station** and **Elephant & Castle** station are both a 10-minute walk to campus and offer connections to other National Rail services for students traveling from outside London. Visit **National Rail** website <https://www.nationalrail.co.uk/journey-planner/> to plan your journey by rail. Both stations are also on the London Underground network.
- **Bus Routes:** Several buses serve the area such as buses **35, 133, 343** from London Bridge, including routes passing through Borough High Street where the campus is located.
- **Walking & Cycling:** The campus is easily accessible **by foot**. **Bicycle and E-Scooter hires** are also widely available in London for a small charge and there are docking stations located opposite HSU's London campus.
