Important information about your course

Applicants with criminal convictions

With the exception of the BSc (Hons) Sport & Exercise course (with optional Foundation Year, applicants must complete an Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check before you enrol. If you have lived outside the UK for six months or more in the last five years, you will also need to provide a police check from the relevant country or countries.

Having a criminal record does not automatically stop you from studying at the university. However, the university is legally required to check that students who will take part in regulated activities — such as placements involving children or vulnerable adults — are suitable to do so, and also has a duty to protect the wider HSU student, staff and patient community.

Any unfiltered criminal convictions that you declare, or that are found through these checks, will be reviewed under the university's Criminal Convictions Procedure. You will be told the outcome. The university may withdraw an offer if a conviction is not considered suitable for the course, or if you do not take part in the checking process.

You should tell the university as soon as possible about any unfiltered convictions, cautions, reprimands, or warnings to avoid delays. More information about unfiltered offences is available on the DBS website.

You will need to pay for the Enhanced DBS check yourself. This cost is non-refundable. Further details and instructions will be sent to you before enrolment.

Signing up to the DBS Update Service recommended, as it keeps your status up to date and means your status can be checked by employers, placements etc without the need to request a new, full check each time.

If you are subject to any cautions, reprimands, warnings, charges or conviction during your time as a student you must declare these to the university immediately.

Guidance for Applicants with a Disability or Health Condition

We are keen to support students who wish to share a disability or health condition and encourage you to discuss this with us at the earliest opportunity so we can support you throughout your enrolment and student journey. At this time, our buildings have certain areas that may pose challenges for students with mobility needs. Other declarations

You should also share with us- ideally within your application – if any of the following apply:

- Involvement in disciplinary proceedings during paid or voluntary employment or within education establishments.
- Involvement with safeguarding proceedings, social services, or related organisations.
- Enrolment on a health or social work professional course at another University.

Practical teaching

In practical classes, students will be expected to practice testing, measuring physical performance and some body measurements and statistics such as weight. They may also practice rehabilitation skills on each other in mixed-gender groups. This may involve physical contact with other students. You will need to wear suitable practical clothing for these sessions.

If you have any concerns about this, you should contact the university before applying or accepting an offer. If your concerns relate to religion, disability, or another protected characteristic, the university will discuss reasonable adjustments where possible. Any adjustments must still allow you to meet the course requirements and professional standards.

Course delivery and clinical placements

In accordance with BASRaT regulations, BSc and MSc Sport Rehabilitation and Therapy students are required to successfully complete a total of 400 hours of placement experience. It is important to note that students are responsible for funding their own transport costs to and from the placement sites.

While HSU maintains some established links to placement opportunities within the vicinity, students may be required to actively seek and secure their own placements.

Attendance

Students are required to attend a minimum of 80% of all practical skills classes, tutorials and science laboratory sessions. Student attendance is monitored to identify indicators on non-engagement which may result in poor academic or clinical performance.

Additional costs

Students should be aware that there may be other course costs in addition to course fees. Some of the potential costs you may need to consider are provided in the table below, but please note that this is not an exhaustive list.

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| <p>Uniform</p> <p>Students are expected to purchase a branded polo shirt to be worn for practical teaching, placements, assessments and any outward-facing roles such as open days and visits.</p> | <p>Approx £23, to be purchased from the institutions VX3 club shop page HERE.</p> |
| <p>Professional membership</p> <p>It is recommended that BSc Sport and Exercise Science students apply for student membership with the Chartered Association of Sport & Exercise Science but this is not essential.</p> | <p>Approx £26-31 per annum</p> |
| <p>Additional training requirements</p> <p>Students on the BSc Sport Rehabilitation and MSc Sport, Rehabilitation and Therapy course must complete a recognised advanced trauma care qualification to be eligible for BASRaT registration.</p> | <p>Cost approx. £350</p> |
| <p>Student Card</p> <p>You will be given an HSU Student Card at no charge at the point of registration. Replacement cards will be issued at cost to the student.</p> | <p>£10.00 (non-refundable) per replacement card.</p> |
| <p>Travel costs</p> <p>Students are expected to arrange and fund their own travel to and from university.</p> | <p>Costs dependent on individual travel arrangements.</p> <p>UK students from low-income backgrounds living in Lulworth House accommodation may be eligible for the university's Halls of Residence Travel Bursary to assist with the costs of travelling between Lulworth House and the university campus. | <p>Teaching materials</p> <p>Teaching materials are made available in electronic format on the Virtual Learning Environment. If students wish to have a printed copy they may print these materials at their own cost (see below).</p> <p>Core texts are available in the library but there are limited numbers, and most students buy some, but not necessarily all, textbooks. Applicants are advised not to purchase these in advance.</p> | <p>Costs vary depending on personal preferences.</p> |
| <p>Photocopying/printing</p> <p>Students must cover photocopying/printing costs with the exception of necessary copying of patient records required in clinic.</p> | |
| <p>IT Equipment</p> <p>Students are advised to purchase their own laptop or tablet to support their studies.</p> | <p>Costs vary depending on personal preferences.</p> |
| <p>Gym membership</p> <p>Students may pay an annual fee to join our on-site gym (Bournemouth campus only). This is an optional cost but please note gym membership is a requirement for some HSUSU/Health Sciences University sports societies.</p> | <p>Current annual fee: £75</p> |
| <p>Social activities</p> <p>HSUSU organises social activities for HSU students. This includes a programme of activities during Welcome Week for new students to support the transition to university life, and other social events and activities throughout the year. Students are advised to allow a budget for social activity when budget planning.</p> | <p>Costs vary depending on interests and participation.</p> <p>UK students from low-income backgrounds may be eligible for the university's Welcome Week Social Events Bursary to assist with the social costs of Welcome Week. 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| <p>Lockers</p> <p>A limited number of lockers are available to rent from the University's Students' Union (HSUSU) for the storage of personal belongings.</p> | <p>Current cost: £10 (non-refundable)</p> |
| <p>Graduation</p> <p>Students who successfully complete their course will be invited to attend a graduation ceremony. This is optional.</p> <p>Graduates can attend the ceremony free of charge but must hire a gown from our approved supplier.</p> <p>Guest tickets for friends and family may be subject to a fee. Graduates will be notified of the cost and the number available to purchase ahead of the event.</p> <p>Any travel or accommodation costs associated with attending the ceremony must be covered by the graduate/guest.</p> | <p>Gown hire: approx. £39.</p> <p>Graduate tickets: Free</p> <p>Guest tickets: approx. £20 – 25.</p> <p>Travel/accommodation: Costs vary depending on personal preferences.</p> |
