Important information about your course

Relevant experience and professional conduct

When applying to the MSc Speech and Language Therapy (pre-registration) course, it is essential that you have experience interacting with people from a variety of backgrounds and in different settings. Just as important is your ability to reflect on these experiences and explain how they have helped you develop the skills and qualities expected of a Speech and Language Therapist. There are many ways you can gain experience - this might be as part of a programme of study or in a paid or voluntary capacity and doesn't always need to be within a care setting. Interacting with people with different life experiences will help you develop a deeper level of understanding of the diversity of the population who access health and social care, as well as those in education and justice settings.

Enhanced DBS Check and police checks

Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) clearance is a course requirement. DBS checks are required due to the nature of working with vulnerable groups, including children and adults, and are a requirement of the regulatory bodies governing courses. If you have lived outside the UK for six months or more in the last five years, you will also need to provide a police-check from the relevant country or countries. **You are responsible for covering the cost of your enhanced DBS Check and any Police Checks required.** These costs are non-refundable.

Students must subscribe to the DBS update service for the duration of the course so that DBS clearance can be confirmed as required.

Costs:

- Enhanced DBS Check: approx. £58.
- Police checks: Subject to local charges.
- DBS update service: currently £16 per annum, plus a £5 admin fee.

Applicants with criminal convictions

Having a criminal record does not automatically stop you from studying at the university. However, the university is legally required to check that students who will take part in regulated activities, such as placements involving children or vulnerable adults, are suitable to do so, and also has a duty to protect the wider HSU student, staff and patient community.

Any unfiltered criminal convictions that you declare, or that are found through these checks, will be reviewed under the university's Criminal Convictions Procedure. You will be told the outcome. The university may withdraw an offer if a conviction is not considered suitable for the course, or if you do not take part in the checking process.

You should tell the university as soon as possible about any unfiltered convictions, cautions, reprimands, or warnings to avoid delays. More information about unfiltered offences is available on the [DBS website](#).

If you are subject to any cautions, reprimands, warnings, charges or conviction during your time as a student you must declare these to the university immediately.

Pre-enrolment health and vaccination screening

You will be required to complete a Pre-enrolment Health and Vaccination Screening prior to enrolling for this course. This is to protect the health and safety of the HSU community, including the patients you will be working with, and to ensure the university can adequately support you in your studies. This is a mandatory process.

The screening involves an initial triage assessment with our approved independent Occupational Health provider. You will need to pay for the cost of your pre-enrolment health screening £28.50.

Any follow-up appointments required for the purposes of placement will be covered by the university, including any vaccinations that are needed. Missed appointments, second opinions requested by applicant or student will need to be covered by yourself. Students requiring additional vaccinations outside of the recommended schedule will need to cover those additional costs.

All students having NHS placements will need to provide evidence of having the following vaccinations, having a blood test to confirm immunity or having the vaccinations if needed:

- occupational Hepatitis B x4 doses
- MMR
- Varicella
- TB

All students are strongly advised to be immunised against Covid-19, Polio, Tetanus, Diphtheria, and the seasonal flu are up to date.

If the screening highlights any health concerns which may impact your ability to participate in your course or chosen career, we will contact you to discuss this. In limited circumstances it may be necessary to withdraw your offer.

Annual health questionnaire

Students are also required to complete an annual questionnaire about their health; if any issues are identified students may not be able to act as subjects in practical classes or attend clinical placements.

Guidance for Applicants with a Disability or Health Condition

We are keen to support students who wish to share a disability or health condition and encourage you to discuss this with us at the earliest opportunity so we can support you throughout your enrolment and student journey. At this time, our buildings have certain areas that may pose challenges for students with mobility needs. We strongly recommend that you tell us about any long-term health conditions, learning difficulty or disability you may have. This is so we can assess whether we can deliver the course in such a way that you can meet the HCPC standards of proficiency and take part without disadvantage both during timetabled teaching and on placement.

Other declarations

You should must also share with us if any of the following apply:

- Involvement in disciplinary proceedings during paid or voluntary employment or within education establishments.
- Involvement with safeguarding proceedings, social services, or related organisations.
- Enrolment on a health or social work professional course at another University.

Course delivery

The course is delivered across 45 weeks and four days for each of the two academic years. Consequently, the course does not run to standard undergraduate term/semester dates. Short holiday periods and dedicated independent study periods are built in throughout the year.

For the MSc Speech and Language Therapy (pre-registration) course the pass mark is 50%.

Practical teaching

In practical classes, students practise examination and treatment skills on each other in mixed-gender groups. This involves physical contact with other students.

If you have any concerns about this, you should contact the university before applying or accepting an offer. If your concerns relate to religion, disability, or another protected characteristic, the university will discuss reasonable adjustments where possible. Any adjustments must still allow you to meet the course requirements and professional standards.

Clinical placements

Students are required to successfully complete at least 562.5 hours of practice placement. Over the two years of the programme, you will complete a practice-based learning unit which includes three assessment placement periods.

Students must complete any mandatory training as a requirement before going on placement.

The locality of placements can take students across Dorset, Hampshire, Wiltshire, Sussex and other neighbouring counties. This will incur additional costs and students need to plan for this in their annual budget. Typically, these costs are for travel and, if necessary, accommodation to access placement. The amount of money involved will depend on the site of the placement, distance from home, and the type and length of placement. Costs of several hundred pounds can be expected, and exceptionally over £1000 per year.

UK students may claim placement travel expenses, and costs towards any additional accommodation that may be required in order to access placements from the NHS support fund but these costs are reimbursed to a threshold. Students on community placements or placements that require travel between site locations, who are explicitly using their car to go from one location to another for care delivery (e.g. home visits, school visits) must have Business Car Insurance coverage. The NHS does not reimburse any costs associated with business insurance coverage.

During clinical placement, students will be expected to:

- Attend allocated placement sessions and complete all required clinical hours or weeks of attendance.

- Work scheduled clinical shifts, which may include morning, afternoon, evening, and occasional weekend sessions depending on service need.
- Participate in academic teaching or supervision sessions that may take place outside clinical hours.
- Discuss any known commitments that could affect placement availability with the course team as early as possible.
- Seek approval from the appropriate course or clinical lead for any period of absence beyond normal sickness reporting processes.

Students on placement are expected to behave professionally at all times and follow university placement and clinical procedures. Appropriate dress and good personal hygiene are required when attending classes and while on placement.

Clinical uniform

Students will be provided with a limited number of HSU branded top items, for the purposes of placement, free-of-charge. Additional items or replacements must be purchased from the University's official supplier at the student's own cost.

Students are expected to provide their own flat black shoes with a non-slip rubber sole, and their own dark shaded trousers for the purposes of placement. Students wishing to wear a head covering such as a hijab should provide a plain black version at their own cost.

Preparatory studies

Students will be sent a Pre-Arrival Reading Suggestions list which includes ideas of books and other resources to explore before starting the course.

Students must also complete any mandatory training as a requirement before going on placement.

Attendance

Attendance to all teaching sessions and clinical placement is mandatory. A good level of attendance is a requirement of professional and regulatory bodies for all healthcare courses. Students with poor attendance, without exceptional circumstances, will be subject to Fitness to Practise processes and risk their ability to complete the course and register with the HCPC.

International students studying under a Student visa are reminded that attendance and engagement requirements form part of the conditions of their immigration permission as well as the academic requirements of the course. The University is required to monitor attendance and participation and may need to report concerns regarding non-attendance, poor engagement, or prolonged absence to the relevant authorities. Students are therefore expected to attend all scheduled teaching, supervisory, and assessment-related activities and to inform the University promptly of any circumstances affecting their attendance.

Additional costs summary
